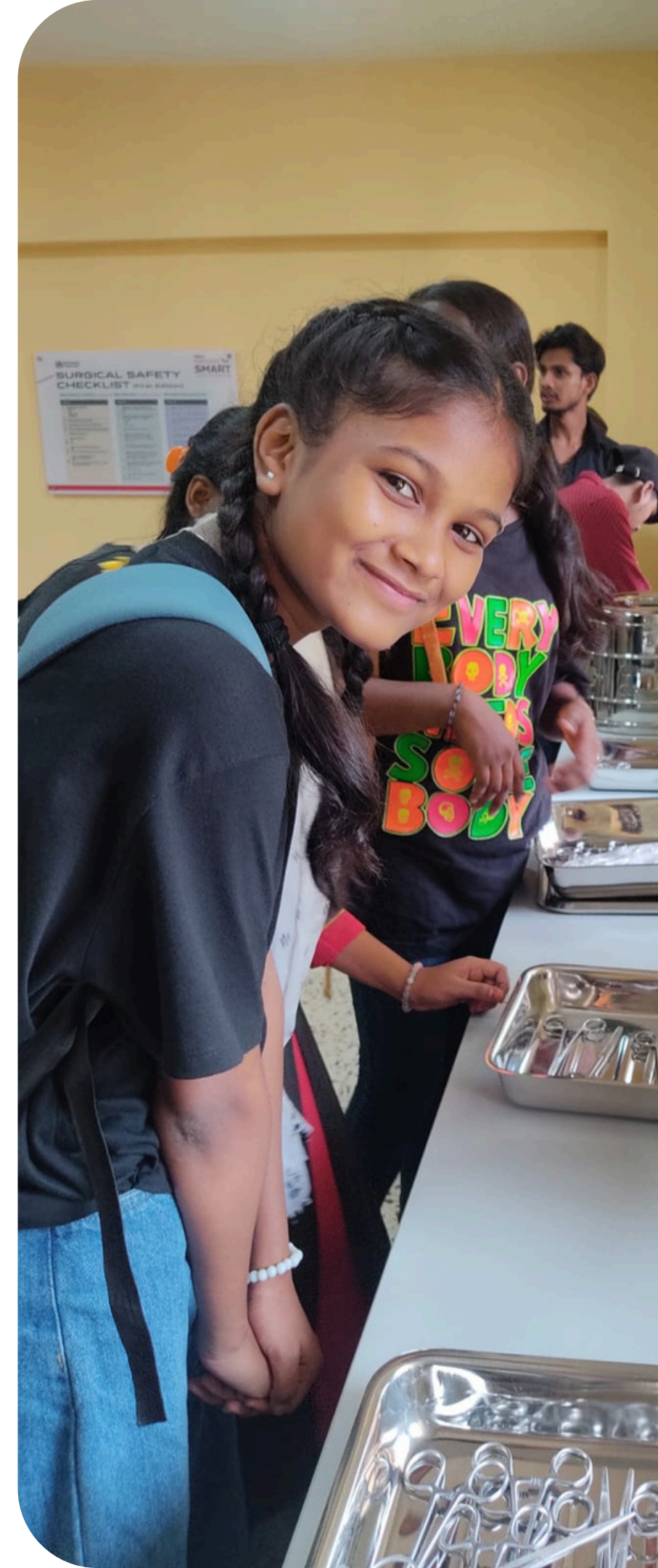
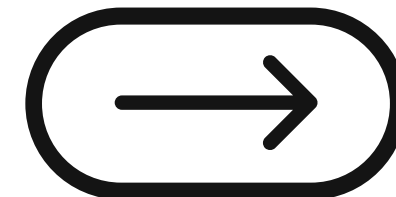

C.O.G.F is a movement to enrich the life of deprived children through God's love, better security and through right education.



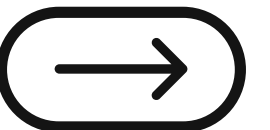

C.O.G.F. focuses on reaching out to street children through our Outreach program. Initially, they participate in our step-in center program while still living on the streets. If a child decides to change their life, we take them under our care and guide them through our Rehabilitation project, which is tailored to their age. This process helps them gradually and fully transition away from street life.

After 15 years of working with marginalized children in Mumbai, COGF firmly believes that the root cause of these issues lies in rural poverty and that it must be addressed first. This will lower the distress migration caused due to loss of livelihood, water shortage, food insecurity, loss of vegetation and biodiversity. PROJECT PARIVARTAN is an initiative which works in the area of health, education, advocacy and livelihood, empowering the rural community towards better quality of life

COGF launched the Atgaon Project in 2019, focusing on rural development initiative.



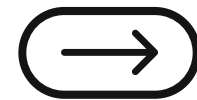

Former COGF children are provided with financial support to complete their graduation also needy children are provided with financial assistance

Children below 12 are admitted to regular school and children completing 10th are admitted to college

Data / Outcome

- documentation for 15 children were done
- Total 21 children were under our scholarship programme. Out of these children 4 cleared 10th, 1 cleared 12th state board and 1 succesfully graduated with a BA.
- 14 Girls and 10 boys are educated in regular school and college. 1 girl, 2 boys cleared their 12th state board and 2 girls ,1 boy cleared their 10th state board.
- 6 girls and 2 boys were under step-up schooling and 1 boy cleared 10th NIOS
- Total six children were reintegrated 4 boys and 2 girls.

HEALTH AND NUTRITION

Nutritious meal (breakfast/lunch) and basic medical check -up

SKILL TRAINING

young adults are taken for industrial visits and workshops are conducted to identify their skill set and also sent for training to attain employable skills.

STEP-UP SCHOOLING:

Children above 12yrs are taught in our special syllabus (STEP-UP)and enrolled for 10th/12th (NIOS BOARD).

REHABILITATION

- 1.Children below 12yrs are enrolled in near by school.
- 2.Presenting children subject to neglect child before CWC to be put in safe HOMESo deaddiction centers.


Data / Outcome

- 254 days, Breakfast and one time meal was provided at Kalwa center and 167 Breakfast and meals were given in Kurla center.
- Children were taken for visit to Parle Company,Smart Academy (tech Mahindra) and Voltas tata strive skill devlopment center.
- 33 children from Kalwa center and 24 children from kurla center were enrolled under step-up schooling . 3 Girls, 2 boys cleared 10th NIOS and 1 boy cleared 12th from both centers.
- 2 student admitted to junior college and 1 to Bcom.
- 8 children admitted to hostel









Measuring Progress: Project Pragati

Activity / Project

EDUCATION

- Step-Up Education Program at 3 brick kiln.
- Free Tuition classes at 4 village hubs for VANA MITRA children.
- Life skills sessions and Counselling for Drop-out students, and young girls.

HEALTH AND NUTRITION

- Nutrition training for women
- General Health camp and follow ups.
- Workshops conducted on hygiene and sanitation.
- One Time Nutritious Meal for children

NATURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

- Restoration of infrastructure of existing municipal school.
- Renovation of commons water bodies.

ENVIRONMENT AND SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

- Afforestation
- Empowering the tribal children to protect their environment through VANA MITRA CLUB.

Data / Outcome

- 47 brick kiln children received consistent education
- 76 children received regular tuitions
- 3 dropout children re-enrolled for board exams
- 63 children attended life skill training sessions
- 7 medical camps benefited 350 individuals
- 38 nutrition trainings for 50 women
- 92 children attended health & hygiene workshop
- 121 days of one-time meals served to brick kiln children
- Tansa High School roof restoration benefited 146 children
- 2 common water bodies renovated at Nandgaon for 70 families (200 people & livestock)
- 700 forest saplings planted
- 500 fruit saplings (80% survival rate)
- 500 flower saplings (75% survival rate) 400 vegetable saplings for 33 brick kiln families
- 30 saplings distributed from project nursery
- Total saplings planted: 1930



IMPACT 1

In 2016, Latif and Durga Khan joined the COGF family, seeking a supportive environment after facing early life challenges. Orphaned and abandoned by their father, they were cared for by their aunt. Despite never having attended school, COGF provided them with a stepping stone to education through its step-up schooling program.

Remarkable Achievements:

- Latif secured 61% (2022) in her 10th exams through NIOS Board and completed 12TH MCVC (ACCOUNTING AND OFFICE MANAGEMENT) with 55.17% (2024)
- Durga achieved 58% (2023) in her 10th standard exams through NIOS.

Pursuing Brighter Futures:

- Durga is currently pursuing her 2nd year in Fashion Designing.
- Latif is in his 1st year of BFSI (Banking, Financial Services, and Insurance) at TISS (Tata Institute of Social Sciences) and aspires to establish his own business.

Despite facing challenges at home, where her mother works as a train vendor and her father occasionally finds work as a housekeeper, Saniya demonstrated remarkable dedication and hard work.

Achievements:

- Saniya successfully completed her 10th standard exams through NIOS (National Institute of Open Schooling) with an impressive 67% score.
- She is currently pursuing 12th standard in Commerce, furthering her academic journey.

Giving Back:

- Saniya volunteers to teach younger children at the center, paying it forward and inspiring others with her journey.

IMPACT 3

Location: Nandgaon (Dumdachapada), Atgaon

Beneficiaries: 30 families, approximately 150 people

Problem Statement: Inadequate access to clean water

Solution:

- Upgraded old hand pump by installing a motor
- Laid down 500m water pipe connecting hand pump to village
- Installed 5000-liter water tank for storage

Key Outcomes:

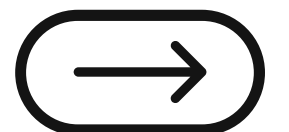
- Easy access to clean water for villagers and livestock
- Improved health and well-being for the community
- Enhanced livelihoods through reduced time spent on water collection

Partnership:

- Collaborative effort between our CSR partner (CITIUSTECH), our COGF team and villagers.
- Villagers contributed labor and resources

IMPACT 4

Beneficiary: Ajay, Adivasi tribe, Savardev village, Atgaon

Medical History: Previously treated for Tuberculosis, no old reports available

Presenting Complaints:

- Breathing difficulties, Cold and cough, Dizziness

Medical Intervention:

- Nebulizing therapy administered to address respiratory distress
- Oxygen saturation (SpO2) levels improved
- 3-day treatment and medication provided

Outcome:

- Ajay's condition stabilized, and he returned to normal health
- Life-saving intervention, especially given the difficulties in accessing nearby hospital and financial constraints

Impact:

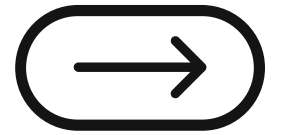
- Timely medical intervention prevented potential complications and saved Ajay's life
- This demonstrates the importance of accessible healthcare for marginalized communities



AJAYS MEDICAL INTERVENTION

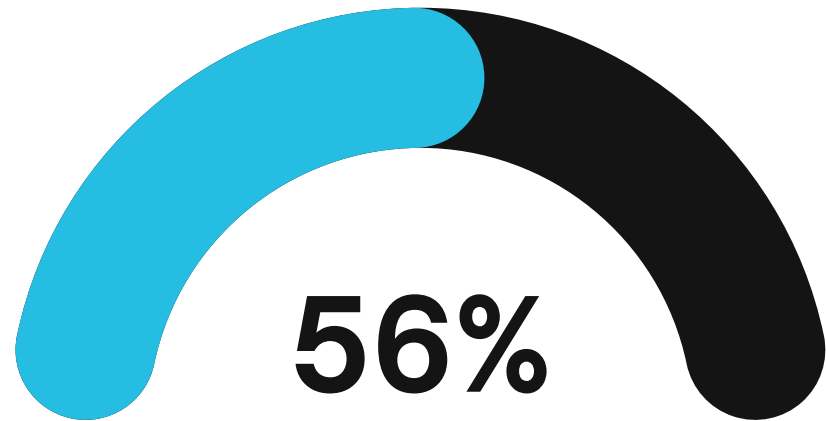


Performance since 2007

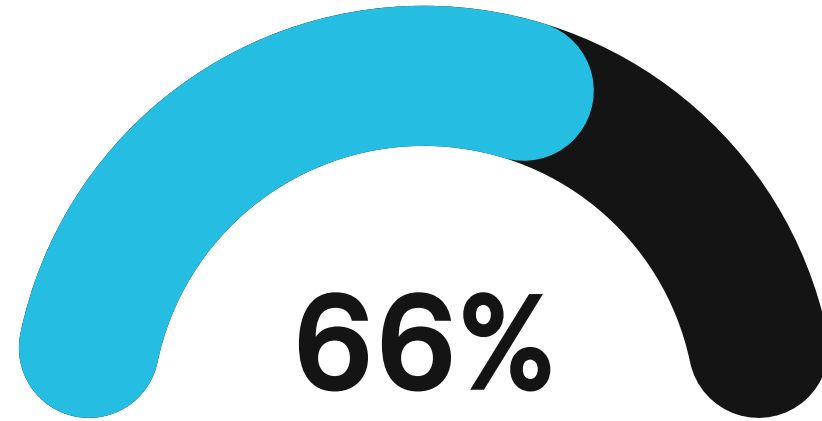

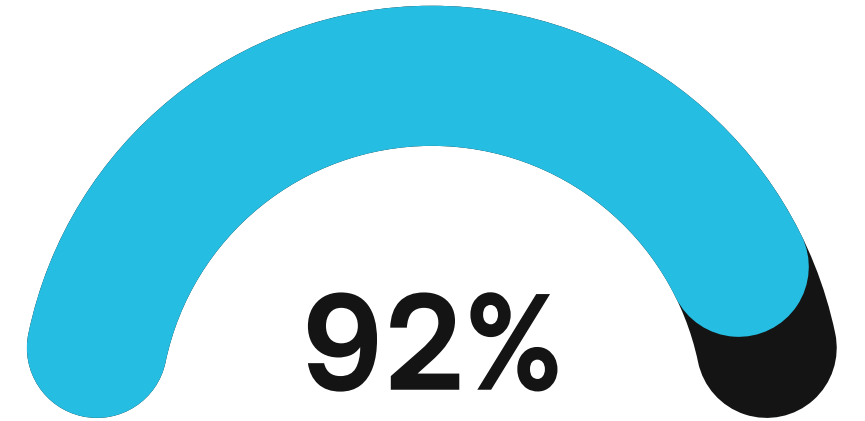

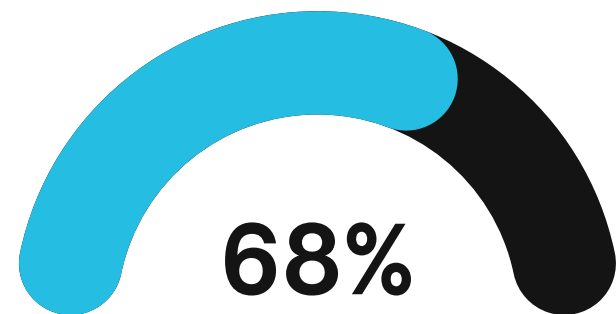

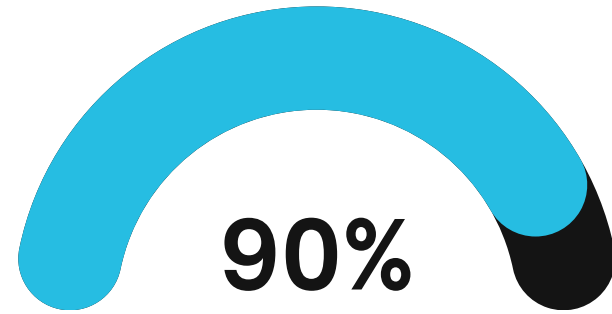

"COGF hosted a Sports Day event, bringing together children from all centers, to promote teamwork, unity, and a spirit of healthy competition."



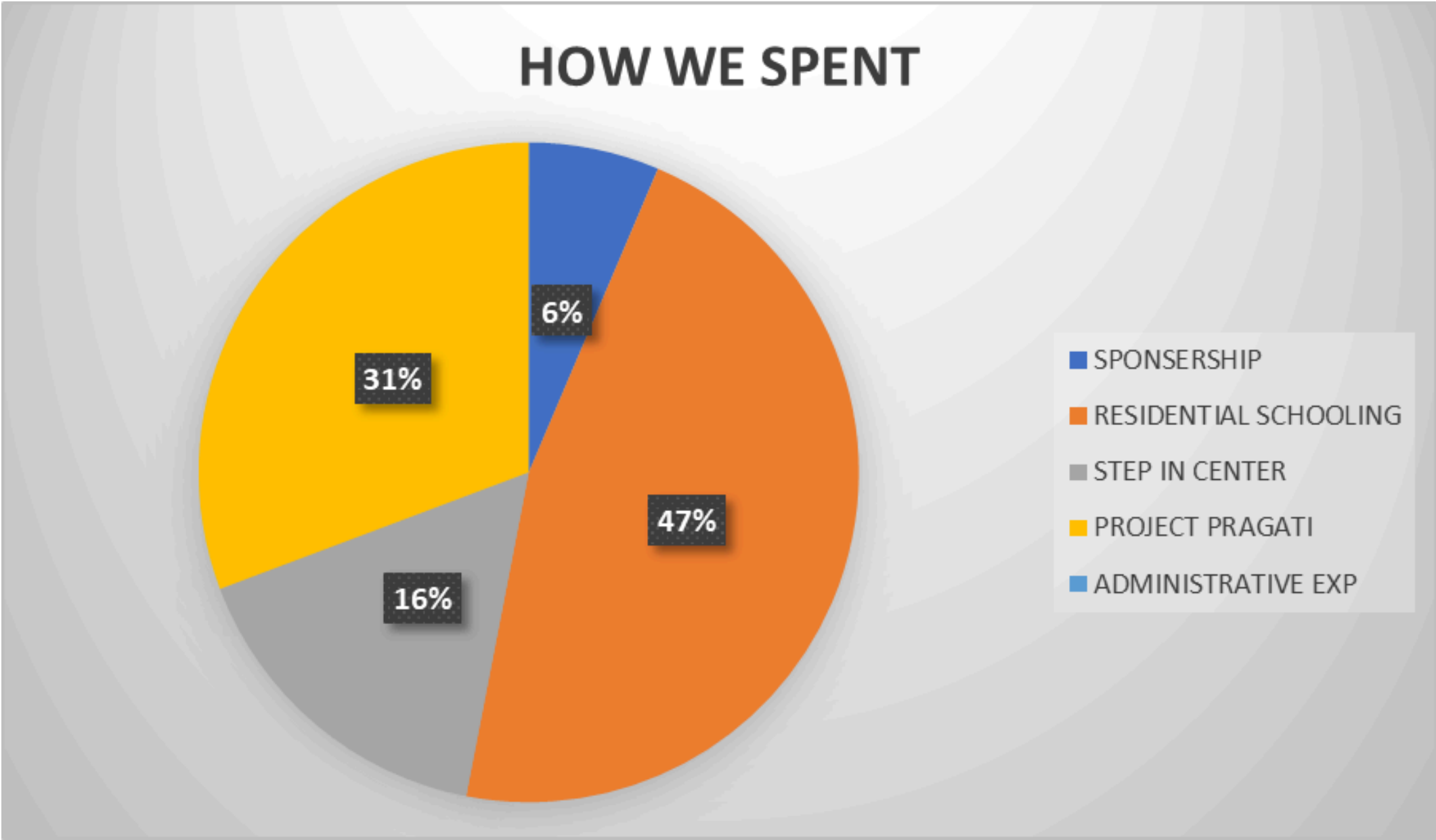
